## **SIDNEY ZION HOSTS PROVOCATIVE NEW TALK SHOW ON SHALOM TV**

Outspoken, opinionated, passionate, and articulate Sidney Zion, a man with a wry sense of humor who is counted among the most well-respected columnists and journalists in America, is hosting his own talk show on Shalom TV entitled "Out of the Mouth Of Zion."

A newspaperman for 43 years and a federal prosecutor during the Kennedy administration, Mr. Zion has covered politics and law for the New York Times, served as a columnist for the New York Post and New York magazine, and is currently published in the Daily News. He has written five books, and has been honored with the Ben Hecht Award for Outstanding Journalism, Overseas Press Club of America Award, and New York State Bar Association Award. The new television program is a forum for Mr. Zion to express his views on virtually every topic of Jewish interest.

"I have had the enormous pleasure of working with Sidney Zion for thirty years," said Shalom TV President and CEO Rabbi Mark S. Golub. "There is simply no one like him when it comes to straight-shooting commentary, especially when it involves the State of Israel."

An ardent supporter of Israel, Sidney Zion's articles in America's leading magazines have assisted readers in placing the ongoing Middle East conflict into historical and contemporary perspective. Known to be right-of-center, Mr. Zion looks to lock horns debating outstanding figures in the Jewish world on Shalom TV.

"Viewers are going to get a lot of controversy, a lot of heat, and a lot of light on this new show," asserted Sidney Zion. "It's about time that there was a Jewish-oriented television network in America, and I'm happy to be a part of Shalom TV."

The candid and multitalented Sidney Zion graduated from University of Pennsylvania and Yale Law School, working as a trial lawyer until becoming Assistant US Attorney for New Jersey in 1961. Two years later, he took a reporting job with the New York Post, later moving to the New York Times as an award-winning legal correspondent. In 1970, he was named editor of Scanlan's magazine, only to return in 1977 to the New York Post, this time as a columnist. The following year he wrote a column for New York magazine, and in 1994 he moved his byline to the New York Daily News. In 2000, Mr. Zion reunited with the New York Post before returning to the Daily News as a bi-weekly columnist.



Feisty and well-informed, Mr. Zion is a popular guest on television programs "The McLaughlin Group," "Good Morning America," "Today," "Charlie Rose Show," "Firing Line," "60 Minutes," and "ABC Eyewitness News." His books include *The Autobiography of Roy Cohn* and *Loyalty and Betrayal: The Story of the American Mob*; two collections of his columns: *Read All About It* and *Trust Your Mother but Cut the Cards*; and the political novel, *Markers*. He is now writing his memoir.
